Marshall earned its berth in the Northern Regional

playoffs against Annandale when a Madison bid for a two-point conversion and a victory in the fourth quarter went awry.

Although the Statesmen fumbled six times, it was the one Madison fumble that set up the score that led to the important 7-6 triumph.

Marshall's Bill Brown recovered the fumble on his 45. Marshall then drove to a score on a 16-yard pass from Greg Schwemley to Tommy Davis.

Schwemley was subbing for Mike Oliff, who was injured last week against Oakton.

Madison scored in the fourth quarter on an 18-yard pass from Robbie Slingerman to Mike Shaffer, but the two-point pass attempt failed.

Langley's Joe McMahon scored one touchdown and passed for another in a 20-0 beating of host McLean. McMahon opened the scoring with a 39-yard pass and run to Mike Sharrett in the second quarter.

Glenn Evans added a touchdown for Langley in the third quarter on a 46-yard run and McMahon capped the scoring with a one-yard touchdown plunge in the fourth quarter. Langley re-

Oakton's powerful offense came alive in the second half to obliterate Herndon, 50-14, at Oakton.

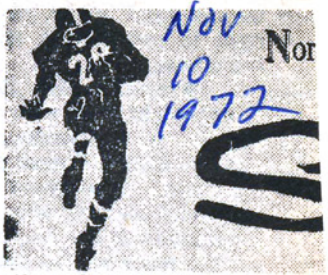

Marshall Slips Past Warhawks

FALLS CHURCH — On the strength of an extra point kick by Blair Flynn and a losing gamble for a two-point pass play following a score, Marshall edged upset-minded Madison by a scant, 7-6, and by winning, will meet Annandale, winners over Fairfax, in the Northern Regional Saturday at Woodson.



Marshall, playing without the services of star signal caller Mike Oliff, overcame many misplays in staving off their District rival, and completed the Great Falls District season with a perfect 7-0 record, showing a 9-1 overall record, their only loss at the hands of Fairfax in the sixth game of the season, 21-6.

Oliff, though suited in the event of immediate necessity, was kept out of last night's game on the Statesmen's field, due to an ankle injury he received in the Oakton game. He will be ready for action against Northern District foe Annandale next Saturday.

Gregg Schwemely, only a freshman quarterback, led the Marshall attack which totaled 151 yards. He completed three of eight passes, one for his team's touchdown, for 51 yards, while Mark Jones led all the statesmen running backs with his contribution of

49 yards on the ground. Madison, despite recovering six of seven Marshall fumbles, could manage only 76 total yards, split evenly by air and on the ground. Robbie Slingerman, a junior, called the Warhawk plays, and completed three of six passes, one for his team's lone score.

In a strictly defensive end Bill Brown recovered the loose pigskin on the Madison 45.

Schwemely moved his team towards the Warhawk goal line, his best play of the series other than the scoring play was a 19 yard pass to Blair Flynn. It was from the 16 yard line he found his wide receiver, Tommy Davis open, and pumped the ball to him for the only Marshall touchdown. Flynn then converted with the extra point kick that was eventually the margin of victory.

Madison failed to threaten the Statesman goal until the final quarter, when they

covered the last of the Marshall fumbles, this time in close, on the Statesmen's 20 yard line. One running play netted them but one yard, so on the next play, Slingerman dropped back and tossed a 19-yard scoring pass to end Mike Shaffer. A pass play was attempted for the two points and possible upset victory, but it fell incomplete and Marshall remained on top and gained the right for the Regionals.
