# Marshall Rips Langley, 41-7

FAIRFAX — Marshall remained in the thick of the battle for laurels in the Great Falls District, as they trounced AAA League rival Langley by 41-7 last night at Marshall.

The win gives the Statesmen a 3-1 league mark, a full game behind Oakton who is unbeaten in four league games.

Last year Marshall went through the season unbeaten in the Great Falls District and lost but a single game overall, while Oakton failed to win a single game. Both teams have lost three games in overall play to date and post identical 6-3 records out of league.

Mike Oliff guided the Marshall win, throwing for three touchdowns as he completed 7 of 11 passes for 89 yards, while Al Boudreau rushed for 114 yards in 22 carries and scored two touchdowns. In total yards the Statesmen rolled up 266 on the ground and 136 by the air route.

Taking the opening kickoff Marshall went the distance with Oliff passing 14 yards to wide receiver Larry Caynor. A kick attempt failed.

Early in the second period Boudreau capped a long drive of some 60 yards from two yards out, then took a pass from Oliff for two points. Later in the same period Oliff found Curt Midkiff from 15 yards for another scoring strike. A run attempt for two points failed.

Langley made good on their lone threat in the high scoring second quarter, quarterback Joe McMahon guiding them to the Marshall one, where Phil Culbertson broke over, Greg Allen converted.

Forcing Langley to punt midway in the third quarter, fleet Mike Atalla returned the kick 33 yards inside the Saxon's five. Two plays later Boudreau went over, a pass attempt for two extra points failed.

Marshall added two more scores in the final period when Oliff found Midkiff again, this time four yards away, Paul Reeves kicked the extra point. Then soph signal caller Brent

McDaniel took over for Marshall and guided the Statesmen goalward, completing a 42-yard pass to Eric Mondres to set up the score from the one where McDaniel took it in himself, then passed for two points to Stu Hieronimos.
