Oliff's Field Day Carries Marsha

Marshall's Mike Oliff had one of those games last night that makes campus heroes out of quarterbacks. He ran for three touchdowns, passed for two more and directed the veer offense so well that most of Falls Church's rooting section left at the end of the third quarter.

> Those fans still got their money's worth. The two teams combined for more than 600 vards total offense and scored 32 points in the second period alone. But Marshall remembered to score in the other three quarters too and won the Virginia AAA nondistrict game, 39-14.

> Oliff, who did not have a particularly good game last week in the Statesmen's season-opening loss to Annandale, was superb. Besides his touchdown scampers of 48, 4 and 14 yards, he ran for one conversion, rushed for 69 yards on five carries and completed 10 of 18 passes for 152

> Helping him was Al Boudreau, who gained 144 yards, and end Billy Lowe, who caught five passes for 110 yards. Marshall had 416 total yards, 264 on the ground.

> Falls Church, however, almost made a game of it in the second period when the teams scored five touchdowns in seven minutes.

> The Jaguars closed to 18-14 on a scoring pass from Forrest Kobayashi to Carroll Craig, and then recovered Boudreau's fumble on the kickoff.

But on a second-down play from Marshall's 28, Mike Little intercepted a Kobayashi pass. The Statesmen then went 73 yards in 55 seconds. Oliff threw to Steve Denning for the final five yards and a touchdown with five seconds left in the half.

Oliff Leads Marshall In39-14Rout of Jags

Defense /
Is Strong
In Victory

FALLS CHURCH—Junior quarterback Mike Oliff rallied his troops early in the second quarter last night and the Marshall Statesmen rolled to a 39-14 AAA victory over Falls Church at Marshall.

The Statesmen, defending Northern Regional champs, evened their record at 1-1, while the loss was the first for the Jaguars after an opening season victory last week.

Marshall scored early, taking a 6-0 advantage in the first quarter, but had to hold the Jaguars off with a fine defensive effort, mainly because of short kickoffs which gave the Jags good field position three times in the first half.

The Statesmen held only a 24-14 lead at intermission but rolled it up with single touchdowns in the third and fourth quarters.

Oliff completed 10 of 17 passes for 162 yards while his opposite number, Forrest Kobyashi, hit on eight of 14 for 148 yards. The Marshall rushing attack, led by running back Al Boudreau, rolled up 296 yards while Statesmen's defense held Falls Church to only 98 yards.

Oliff and his troops fought off repeated challenges by the Jaguars in the first half coming out on top at intermission, 24-14.

The Statesmen scored the second time they gained possession of the ball. They took over when a Falls Church punt went astray and out of bounds at the Marshall 46. An offside penalty took the ball to the Falls Church 49, Al Boudreau carried 14 yards to the 35.

Oliff then hit Billy Lowe to the 26 out an offensive holding penalty killed the gain and put the ball back to Marshall's 44. Oliff then came back to hit Lowe again for a 56 yard passrun combination for the Statesmen's first score. The kick for extra point failed.

Oliff got the next score early in the second quarter on a 48-yard run up the middle. The kick again failed.
