Marshall To Host

Yorktown

ARLINGTON — Annandale puts its No. 1 rating on the line tomorrow night at J.E.B. Stuart in the feature game of a 12-game Northern Region AAA football schedule.

The game will mark the '72 debut of both teams in Northern District play and the Atoms will rule a slight favorite.

Both teams are undefeated, Annandale beating Williams, 24-15 and Yorktown, 47-0, while Stuart routed McLean, 31-0 and Madison, 40-13.

Annandale has been ranked No. 1 in the state by the United Press International's Board of Coaches since beating Williams, the pre-season choice as the No. 1 team on the basis of its state championship and 13-0 season in 1971.

In other Northern District games Woodson is at Wakefield, Fairfax at Jefferson and Falls Church at Robinson.

The Great Falls District feature game this week is Yorktown at Marshall.

Marshall, 2-0 on the season and yet to be scored upon, moved into a tie for 14th place in the UPI ratings and will be highly favored to topple Yorktown. Yorktown, a new team in the district this season coming from the defunct Potomac District, has yet to score a touchdown and has only three points, on a field goal against Wakefield in the opening game.

In other Great Falls games Oakton is host to McLean, Washington-Lee is at Langley, and Herndon at Madison.

T. C. Williams, state champ as a representative of the Potomac District last season, opens what appears to be a drive for the Gunston title tomorrow night.

The Titans 33-0 winners over McLean last week, are rolling and it doesn't appear there are any teams in the Gunston League ready to stop them.

Williams plays at Edison tomorrow night. Edison hasn't scored a point in two games this season and has allowed In other Gunston District action Lee is at Fort Hunt, Mount Vernon at West Springfield and Groveton at Hayfield.

Despite playing in the favorites' role against Stuart, Annandale coach Bob Hardage is being extremely cautious.

"I think the record speaks for itself as far as Stuart is concerned. Jerry Fauls does a great job coaching them and they'll be tough. Just look at all the guys Fauls has playing at major colleges. He gets the job done over there," Hardage says.

Stuart, known in the past for its great passing fame, has produced such college stars as Nick Vidnovic, who led North Carolina over Maryland last week and Jim Owings, a receiver on the Georgia Tech team.

But, according to Fauls, he has no real superstars this season, "We have a good group of football players here this season, not as experienced as we've been in the past, and we don't have the depth," the personable coach asserts.

The passing game isn't expected to be a feature of this year's Stuart team. The running game has taken over and has been evident in the two games this season.

Hardage isn't overlooking any of the other teams in the Northern District this season. Fairfax, 2-0 and un-scored upon so far this year, is commanding a lot of attention from Hardage and other coaches in the area.

The Rebels, with their running game built around Fred Caperton, are expected to make it 3-0 Friday night. The Rebels opened with a 40-0 victory over Mt. Vernon and made it look more impressive last week they they beat Fort Hunt, 21-0, a week following Fort Hunt's total domination of Washington-Lee, 33-7.

Marshall, with its two victories and outstanding defense, has become more of a factor in the Great Falls title race. Before the season opened most were looking to defending champion Oakton as the team to beat.

Henry still feels that Oakton is the team that will have to be dealt with. "I think that man-for-man they have the best team in the district. They're big in size but small in depth and on their first two teams they don't have a man who couldn't start for someb dy else," Henry says of the Oakton team.

Oakton handed Marshall a 12-6 serback last season and knocked the Statesman out of contention for the district ritle. The teams play No. 3 at Marshall and, until that time, both are expected to run neck-and-

neck.

Marshall Keeps Rolling, Rips Yorktown by 26-0

FALLS CHURCH — Marshall made it three in a row last night and the Statesmen made it look easy, routing Yorktown, 26-0, in a Great Falls District game at Marshall.

Payton Bailey was the scoring hero for Marshall, but junior Mark Bendorf ran up the most yardage, ecounting for 90 of the total 166 yards. Bailey bulled across on two short runs, one from the three, another from the one, while Bendorf crossed the Patroits goal once on a 15 yard sweep.

Mike Paratore ran hard for Yorktown, totaling 59 of his teams total 139 rushing yardage, but the Patroits could not penetrate the Marshall 30 and failed to threaten. To date the Yorktown club has managed only a field goal by Mike Good.

It was testing time for the first 15 minutes, as both clubs showed good defense, but Marshall began to move as the second quarter began, and midway in the period, signal caller Mike Oliff handed off to Bail-

ey and he bulled over center for the games initial score, Blair Flynn added the kick for extra point.

After intermission the Statesmen forced Yorktown into a punting situation, and on a band snap the kicker attempted to kick on the run, the ball going off his foot and out of bounds at the Patriot 47. Steady and consistant yardage was made to the 15 where Bendorf turned the corner from the 15, Flynn again adding the conversion.

The defensive team took credit for the third Marshall score when Yorktown quartr-back Darrell Goode attempted a pitch-out, the ball missing everybody, and after one bounce, Statesman defensive back Mike Atalla gathered in the loose pigskin and rambled 33 yards to pay dirt. This time the kick was no good but the score was 20-0.

Marshall put the icing on the win in the final quarter on a long drive following a Patriot punt, going all the way to the Yorktown one where Bailey bulled in for the score. A pass attempt for two points failed.

Defensive honors went to Marshall's senior linebacker Steve Perlik, who recovered two Yorktown fumbles.
