Full - Court Press

The multipe attack of Marshall took effect in the second eight minutes, center Mike Clark and Reynolds adding 8 points inside and Tony Pearson hitting 3 times from way outside. The statesmen full - court press forced enough turnovers to keep the Hornets from consistently setting up their 2-2-1 zone and rocketed the score to 28-15.
