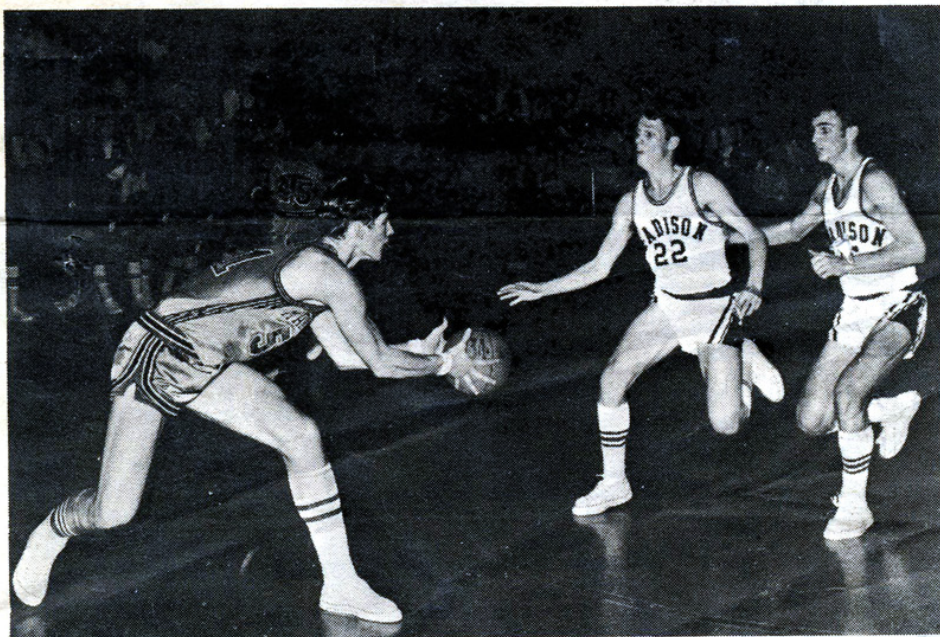


Marshall Victors Over Madison, 84-63

Thompson down to nine points was a blow to the Madison team as his overall average so far is 8 points per

game. The turning point was in the third period as the Statesmen built up a 26 point lead.

Three Share League Lead

Marshall Handed 1st Loss by McLean

Four free throws in the last 18 seconds lifted McLean to a 58-55 Virginia 1-A League Great Falls District triumph over previously undefeated Marshall last night at McLean.

The victory moved McLean into a three-way tie for the league lead with Marshall and Oakton, all 3-1.

Mike Simons' two free throws with 18 seconds left gave McLean a 56-55 lead. Marshall's Vince Carbaugh missed a game-winning shot in the closing seconds and Bruce McCall hit two free throws with no time left for McLean's final margin.

The teams fought to a 14-all tie after the first period, and McLean spurted to a 30-22 lead at the half. But Marshall came back in the third period to trail, 40-38, then went ahead 48-47 early in the fourth period. The game was tied twice more before Simons' free throws clinched the win.

McLean is now 5-3 overall, while Marshall fell to 8-1.

Winners' Offense Sputters

Marshall Wins Ninth As Jefferson Rally Fails

Marshall's offense, which ran like clockwork for three periods, turned sour in the final eight minutes but the Statesmen held on for a 50-46 victory over Jefferson in a Virginia 1-A League nondistrict game at Marshall last night.

Inability to hit from the field and four missed one-and-one free-throw opportunities caused Marshall's 44-31 advantage at the start of the final period to quickly dissipate.

Rushed into the void was ailing 6-foot-8 Mike Clark who was withdrawn a few minutes after the start of play. His six points and the clock were enough to stifle the valiant Jefferson effort. The victory was the ninth in 10 decisions for Marshall. Jefferson is 6-4.

Marshall Wins Two- Leads District Play

Marshall swept a home basketball double header last weekend, crunching district opponent Herndon 62-36, and trouncing non-district foe Falls Church 66-44, to retain the inter-city trophy of Falls Church. The two victories put Marshall at 4-1 in district play and 11-1 overall.

6'-5" forward Scott Reynolds started his first

game against Herndon after proving himself a valuable sixth man many times and proceeded to lead the Statesmen to a 62-36 rout of the Hornets. In three quarters of play, Reynolds sank 20 pints and grabbed 8 rebounds.

Marshall ambled to a 15-10 lead in the first period behind 5 buckets from Reynolds and Eldridge Jones. Jones concentrated on recent Herndon threat

Pat Rooney and held him to no score until 4:30 left before halftime.

Full-Court Press

The multiple attack of Marshall took effect in the second eight minutes, center Mike Clark and Reynolds adding 8 points inside and Tony Pearson hitting 3 times from way outside. The statesmen full-court press forced enough turnovers to keep the Hornets from consistently setting up their 2-2-1 zone and rocketed the score to 28-15. In a 1-minute stretch, Marshall gained 3 jump balls on the 5-second close guard rule.

Action after intermission was wild, Clark blocking several shots and Reynolds and Pearson finishing their barrage with assists from foul-troubled Vince Carbaugh.

Empty the Benches

With the outcome decided by the end of the third quarter, 54-30, both coaches emptied the benches and 4 minutes of absolutely no scoring followed before assorted foul shooting determined the final tally. Slivinski, though not a starter, led Herndon with 8 points and 7 rebounds. Marshall won the boards 43-25, including 25-11 the second half, led by Clark with 9.

Marshall's Front Line Downs Langley 60-42

Marshall's strong front line proved too much for Langley last Friday night as the Statesmen won handily 60-42. Forward Eldridge Jones led all scoring with 19 points and Scott Reynolds and Mike Clark added 24 points and 27 rebounds to lead Marshall to its 51-20 rebound advantage.

The first period went even, Reynolds hitting for 6 and Vince Carbaugh 4, balanced by Mike Balvage and Tommy Thompson with 4 each as Marshall took a 14-12 lead.

Then came Marshall's defense, allowing only 5 points in the next 8 minutes while Reynolds added 5 of the 11 points from the Statesmen front court in the period. The Saxons went scoreless the last 4 minutes as Marshall made the last 11 points and led at intermission, 27-17.

Langley Tightens

Langley returned with a stiffer defense, deserting its 3-2 zone and using man-to-man and some zone press to win its only quarter as Balvage and Steve Corey each hit twice and helped

provide the turnovers to counter Marshall's rebounding edge. Clark provided the stunts for the Statesmen, hitting four times on crunching offensive board play. The Saxons needed more backcourt defensive success to win with the score at 39-31 Marshall going into the final period.

E. Jones Breaks Long

Again came the effects of Marshall's full-court press, holding Langley to 6 points until 1:08 was left, when the Marshall bench emptied. The stingy defense had set up 21 points in the period as Jones, often anticipating defensive rebounds by Reynolds and Clark, broke long for 5 field goals, three on assists from Tony Pearson, and the Statesmen rolled up their fifth win to only one loss in district play, 13-1 overall. Balvage led Langley with 14 points and 5 rebounds.

West Springfield, 7-1 overall and 3-0 in the Virginia-1-A League Gunston District, plays host to Mount Vernon (2-1 in the league) at 8 p.m. and Marshall goes to McLean for a game that could put the Great Falls District race into a three-way tie for first place.

Marshall, 8-0 overall and 3-0 in the league, will throw its potent defense against McLean (2-1 in the league), a pattern oriented team that is "not afraid to run," according to its coach, Tom Dolan. Oakton, also 2-1, will be watching the outcome closely.

"I'm looking for a low-scoring game," Dolan said. "All I know is we've got to win it. If we don't, our district race will just about have had it."

Dolan must find a way to penetrate Marshall's pressing man-to-man defense, which has allowed opponents an average of 49 points a game. Marshall has averaged 67 points on offense in the same span, and all five starters are scoring in double figures.

Mike Clark, a 6-foot-8 center, provides Marshall with a big advantage in rebounding as well as a 15-point average.

"We've also got a real good bench," said Marshall coach Bob Smith. "We've got enough guys to really put on the pressure. We're only hitting about 32 per cent of our shots from the floor, but our defense is really coming through for us."

Marshall's main challenge will come from McLean's Mike Simons, a sharpshooting, 6-foot-4 guard with a 21-point average. Simons has also been an outstanding defender for McLean and will guard Clark, despite a four-inch height disadvantage. Feb 17, 1970

Losers Suffer Second Defeat

Oakton Surges Past Marshall To Take Over Great Falls Lead

Oakton used a strong finish to defeat Marshall, 50-43, at Oakton last night and take over first place in the Great Falls District of the Virginia 1-A League.

The teams were tied for the district lead with 5-1 records going into the game. Moreover, the victory avenged Oakton's only previous district loss. It was Marshall's second loss in 15 games this season.

Marshall enjoyed an early

lead but the Cougars moved in front in the second period on the rebounding of Steve Messerli and Bob Smyth. A field goal by Dinky Jones knotted the count at 27-27 for Marshall late in the third but it was to be the last threat for the Statesmen.
