ARLINGTON—Old pro Morris Levin, who is watching his scrimmage games these days, took up where he left off two years ago, as his varsity downed Marshall last night by a score of 64-49, at W-L.

Levin's classic "help and recover" man for man defense frustrated the Statesmen through most of the night, as they allowed but 21 points in the first

half allowing W-L to lead 33-21 at the half.

Jeff Dance was the General's standout on defense as he held Marshall's big gun, George Hopper, to only seven points. Dance himself contributed eight points and six rebounds.

Jim Barbe led the General's scoring attack with a game high of 15 points. Oscar Laurel and Jeff Dance were the leading rebounders with six each. Skip Mann had a perfect night as he shot 4 for 4 from the floor.

The Statesman, led by Mike Oloff's 11 points, stayed within ten points for most of the game. However, W-L's ability to hit the open man against Marshall's full court press, provided the Generals with a wide margin of victory.

This game was W-L's home and seasonal opener, and although the margin of victory was wide, the game was not as impressive as many felt it should have been. W-L, playing home against Madison next Tuesday, is 1-0, while Marshall's record stands at 2-0.
