Atoms in Opener

The Marshall Statesmen avenged a loss on the gridiron by beating the Annandale Atoms 41-36 in basketball last night.

Marshall used a deliberate offense and quick, ball-hawking guards to stifle the poor shooting Annandale team. Annandale missed opportunities in the final quarter to win the game when attempted shots would not fall through.

Doug Burns of Annandale was high point man of the game with 11 points but he

wasn't around when he was needed the most in the final quarter having been sent to the bench after committing his fifth personal.

Marshall maintained a balanced scoring attack. No player scored in double figures. Rick Mullen was the leading Statesmen scorer with nine points. Three others, Bill Engles, John Webber, and Rusty Kelley scored eight points.

Engles and Davey Wallace harrassed the Atoms with ball stealing tactics to lessen the

Annandale scoring threat.

Unbeaten W. Springfield field Rolls Past Marshall, 80-53

SPRINGFIELD—Bob Ferris, Dave Koesters, and company, posted win number three for the hi-flying Titans of West Springfield, as they broke open a respectable game after intermission, and romped over visiting Marshall, 80-53.

It was good defense, and as evidenced good offense, as the Titans forced 23 Statesman turnovers. Steve Bacon stood out defensively, causing numerous Marshall mistakes and was credited with five steals.

Rebounding was another factor, as West Springfield practically owned both boards, especially in the big third quarter when they put the game away.

Ferris not only led his team and all scorers in scoring with 21 points, but also pulled down the most rebounds, 19. He got a big assist in both departments from Dave Koesters, who pumped in 20 points, and hauled in 11 rebounds. Dale Watnee added 15 and Marty McNerney 12 in the Titan attack.

Playing in his senior year, Ferris scored most of his points on his driving, turn-around jumper, hitting seven buckets from the field, and the 6-6 center added seven more points from the foul line.

Koesters also drove to the basket and added a few short jumpers for his 20 points, all but six coming from the field. Watnee had five outside shots and as many free throws, while McNerney also tossed in five field goals.

Marshall had only two players in double figures, Mike Little and Billy Engels, both with 11 points. Glen Balducci added eight as the Statesmen used 10 players trying to find the combination to stay with the potent West Springfield team, who cleared the bench with all but four of their players scoring.

Marshall High stunned favored Edison, 46-36, yesterday and advanced to the semifinals of the eight-school Fairfax City Invitational basketball tournament. In the second game, tournament co-favorite Woodson trounced McLean, 73-62.

Marshall's defense was the difference as the Statesmen held Edison to a 32 per cent shooting average did not give Edison a free throw. Although outscored 36-32 in field goals, Marshall was 14-0 from the free throw line.
