# Woodson Grabs Early Track Lead

May 16, 1971

Woodson, led by Rich Tackaberry's victory in the triple jump and his third-place finish in the long jump, took a three-point, first-day lead over favored Hammond yesterday in the Northern Virginia AAA Regional track and field championships at Lee High School.

After the six field events, Woodson had 14 points, Hammond had 11. McLean and

Yorktown were tied for third with 10 points each. Although no records were broken in the field events, Tackaberry's winning triple jump of 45 feet 5 1/4 inches was the outstanding performance.

Other individual winners included John Wilson of McLean who won the long jump with a leap of 21-3 1/2; Annandale's Andy Hutchinson won the shot put with a toss of 53-1 1/2, and Lee Califf of Hammond won the discus event at 161-3.

In the high jump, Yorktown's Ben Clark upset Bob West of Edison, winning with a jump of 6-3. Kevin Meyers of Herndon successfully defended his regional pole vault title by taking the event with a height of 13-6.

## Depth Proves Decisive

# Denbigh Captures Virginia Honors

WILLIAMSBURG, Va., May 22—Denbigh did not win a single event, but the Newport News school captured the team title at the Virginia AAA League track championships today.

Denbigh's depth proved decisive. It needed only to finish among the first five in the final event, the mile relay, to insure victory. Denbigh finished a comfortable third.

The best Northern Virginia schools could manage in the overall point total was to place four teams in a tie for eighth place.

Area teams swept the discus, with Woodson's Chuck Baer edging Hammond's Lee Califf. Don Chisholm of Yorktown was third. Andrew Hutchinson of Annandale was the shot put winner, with a 55-7 effort.

Kevin Meyers of Herndon successfully defended his pole vault championship although he failed in three attempts at a state record 14-7. Craig Talley of Williams lunged at the tape to defeat fast-closing Lawrence Davis in the 880.

Four state records were broken including Scott Eden's easy 9:17.2 two-mile run, eclipsing the old record by nearly three seconds.

Williams captured three events and placed second in two others but it wasn't until the final event of the program that the Titans were assured of a victory.

Williams scored 33 points and turned back second place Fairmont Heights, 33-27. West Springfield finished third with 23½ points.

The key to Williams' victory was the poor showing in the pole vault relay by Herndon. Herndon, with the area's top vaulter in Kevin Myers, finished second in the event won by Williams.

In addition to the surprising pole vault victory, the Titans were first in the triple jump and shuttle hurdle relay.

The Titans were second in the 880 and four-mile relay.


Two meet records were established during the event which managed to get underway despite day-long rains and chilly temperatures.

# Perlik Paces Marshall Trackmen

Marshall track teams in the past have been noted for their good runners and poor field events men. That summary is due for a change after the Statesmen's performance in winning the Great Falls Relays Saturday.

Steve Perlik recorded the best efforts in the long jump and triple jump to help Marshall finish among the top three teams in four of the five field events.

Marshall finished third in both of the leaping events, primarily because of Perlik's 44-5 1/2 performance in the triple jump and his 20-10 1/2 long jump. Perlik also helped Marshall to place second in the high jump.

Due largely to the efforts of Perlik, the Statesmen amassed 18 points in the field events. This total complemented the 39 picked up in the running events as Marshall outdistanced Oakton, 57-44, for the team championship.

Competing under rainy, less than ideal conditions, Herndon moved ahead in the early going by winning three of the field events.

Bob Gray, Dan Beckett and Jim McLeish won the pole vault for Herndon by equalling the meet record of 36-feet-6. Their efforts bettered their winning height at the recent Haringer Relays by more than a foot.

Led by basketball star Tony Wiggins, Herndon's Hornets broke Langley's meet record in the triple jump by more than four feet. Stan Fleming and Stephen Jackson gave consistent performances in teaming with Wiggins to raise the triple jump standard to 125-6 3/4.

Herndon continued its domination of the field events as McLeish abandoned his pole to edge Perlik with the best individual high jump of 5-11. McLeish's performance resulted in another gold medal for the Hornets, who cleared 16-11 to beat Marshall by three inches.

Madison showed its strength in the field events by placing second in the discus and winning the shot put. Jeff Chillemi led the Warhawk shot putters but it was consistency that won the event. Chillemi, Paul Archibald and Mike MacVey all put the shot over 40 feet.

Oakton's Dudley Johnson was the best individual with a 47-5 effort giving Oakton second place. The Cougars also took second in the long jump and triple jump and third in the discus and pole vaulting. This strong showing left them right behind Herndon when the field events finished.

One of the meet's big surprises turned out to be Marshall's Brent McDaniel. Although this is the first year that he has put the shot, McDaniel tossed the pellet 46-11 1/2 to finish second to Oakton's Johnson. "I should be getting 53 feet by the end of the season," said the Marshall junior. If McDaniel's prediction comes true and he continues to improve, he could succeed Edison's Drexell George as the area's best shot putter next year.

Marshall completely dominated the track events, capturing four firsts, three seconds, and finishing third once. Oakton put on a strong effort to finish second in total points. McLean caught and passed a faltering Herndon team to take third

place. Herndon was shut out in five of the eight running events.

Eddie Gray and Mike Terwilliger each won three gold medals to lead the Statesmen. Gray and Terwilliger combined with Mike Atalla and John Chryst to win the 440 yard relay. McLean and Madison provided the most excitement as the Highlanders edged the Warhawks in the second of two heats.

Washington-Lee and Marshall left the rest of the field in the dust in the distance medley. Marshall's Tom Barnes and Steve Keen built up a small lead over the General's Paul Delong and Jerry DuCrest in the 880 and 440 yard portions of the medley.

Paul Short of W-L caught Marshall's sophomore Joe Pace at the end of their leg to set up a duel between Mark Orndorff of W-L and Dave Cannon of Marshall over the last mile. Orndorff held off a strong challenge by Cannon on the final lap to give W-L its only victory of the day. Cannon, a star cross-country runner on Marshall's Virginia AAA championship team, has just started running again after suffering from bronchitis.

Oakton won the four-mile relay by more than 30 seconds over runner-up Marshall. Brian Mount, Dan Ormrod, Terry Sullivan and Doug Crowley breezed by all their competition. An expected showdown between the Cougars and the Statesmen did not materialize when Dave Watt and Cannon did not run in the four mile event for Marshall. Watt is recovering from a broken foot that kept him from running during February and part of March.

Marshall finished second to McLean in the mile relay, but the Statesmen came back to upset Oakton's heavily favored shuttle hurdle relay team. Both teams competed head-to-head in the second heat. Dusty Kuzma and Curtiss Taylor started the Statesmen off and Gray and Terwilliger capped the victory. Oakton's shuttle hurdle relay team had placed second in the Haringer Relays while Marshall finished fifth.

Marshall's 440 relay team also won the 880 relay for the Statesmen with each runner running the same leg as

he had before. Oakton's four mile relay team won the two mile relay, with Dan Azzara taking Ormrod's place. Keen, Atalla, Chryst and Barnes won the sprint medley for Marshall to end the meet. Keen ran the 440 leg for the Statesmen in both the distance and sprint medleys. He was unofficially clocked in 50.5 seconds.

# Marshall Depth Takes Great Falls

Marshall combined team depth with versatile individual performances to gain a convincing victory at the Great Falls District Track Meet Saturday at Herndon.

Dave Cannon led Marshall with victories in the mile run and the two mile. McLean's Mike Skarlatos was the meet's top individual performer as he scored 20 of his team's 44 points.

Although Herndon is the perennial district powerhouse in the field events, several key performances put Marshall in second place in advance of the running events.

Brent McDaniel, a first year shot putter, turned in a fine performance for Marshall, but was forced to take second honors behind Jeff Chillimi of Madison. McDaniel beat Dudley Johnson and Don Rudzinski of Oakton but he was still disappointed. He said, "It tears me up inside

because I know I can beat him (Chillimi)."

Chillimi, McDaniel and Johnson will be battling for the runner-up spot in the regional meet behind Edison's unbeatable Drexel George.

Steve Perlik again turned in another excellent all-around performance by tying the district record in the long jump and placing second in the triple jump. Perlik's 21-8 in the long jump was necessary to hold off the improving Skarlatos, who hit 21-4.

Tony Wiggins of Herndon broke the district record with a 45-8 effort to beat Perlik in the triple jump.

Herndon dominated the high jump as Jim McLeish won the event, Jim Sweetser placed second and the Hornet's Sid Budd was involved in a three way tie for third place.

Another normally all-Hornet event, the pole vault, was shaken up by Marshall. The Hornets' Bob Gray cleared 13-3 to edge Mike Oliff of

Marshall by three inches for first place in the event.

Chuck Mears of McLean captured the discus with a throw of 144-9 and lifted the Highlanders into third place at the completion of the field events.

The Oakton hurdling duo of Tom Miller and Cliff Walker, was expected to run away with the 120 high hurdles and the 330 intermediates. Indeed, Miller and Walker won the 120 highs, but not before being strongly challenged by Mike Terwilliger and Eddie Gray of Marshall.

Skarlatos was beaten by Madison's Bob Miller in the 100 yard dash although both were clocked in 10.1. "He must have out-haired me," said Skarlatos. Atalla had broken his school record with a 10.0 in the trials, but he stumbled in the finals and had to settle for fourth.

Haynes also placed third in the 220, but came back to leave the field in his dust while winning the 440 with a blistering, record-breaking time of 49.1.

McLean came on to win three of the last four events and tie Oakton for second place in the team standings. Roy Allen stood off a host of challengers to win the half mile in 2:00.4. Skarlatos notched his first victory with a 22.1 clocking in the 220, edging Madison's Miller and Haynes.

The Highlanders completed a highly successful day by beating Marshall at the tape in the mile relay. Kurt Krutilla, running the anchor leg for McLean, caught and passed Marshall's Steve Keen five yards from the finish line. "We're very happy, because we wanted to
