Laurel Leads in Wrestling

Defending champion Laurel High School takes a slim 1 1/2-point margin into the semifinals of the Prince George's County Wrestling Tournament today at Largo.

The Spartans qualified seven men for this afternoon's 1 p.m. semifinal round and had 35 1/2 points. The finals will start tonight at 6.

Laurel is just ahead of Bladensburg, which qualified six men. DuVal, with six qualifiers, has 32 1/2 while Surrattsville, also qualifying six, has 31 points.

The biggest upset of the evening had Northwestern's Owen Horten pinning third-seed Brian Figge of Crossland in 5:51. Defending state champions Tom Orem of High Point and John Hirsch of Laurel both won decisions to advance.

Peary Pulls Ahead

Dual meet champion Peary took a strong lead in the

Montgomery County meet, rolling up 54 points to 49 1/2 for second place Paint Branch at Whitman. Northwood and Kennedy are still in contention with 43 and 40 points, respectively.

The semifinal round begins today at 1 p.m. and the consolation round is tonight at 6. The championship matches begin immediately after the consolations.

Bob Raba of Whitman had the meet's biggest upset as he topped second-seeded Brian Sweeny of Kennedy, 5-1, in overtime in the 187-pound class.

All three defending state champions advanced with easy triumph. Dale Schooley of Gaithersburg recorded a fall in just over five minutes, Richard Montgomery's Dave Hopkins recorded a 13-0 verdict, and Peary's Steve Werts won 8-0.

NORFOLK, Feb. 25 — Frank W. Cox High School of Virginia Beach won four individual titles and one second place and breezed to the Virginia state AAA team wrestling championship tonight before 5,000 at Old Dominion College.

Cox finished with 70 1/2 points, for its second straight title with T. C. Williams of Alexandria second with 38. Six Northern Virginia schools finished among the top 10.

Three Northern Virginia wrestlers won state titles: Robert Peach of Langley (112), Max Lorenzo of Mount Vernon (145) and Eric Heinonen of Lee (155).

Abe Martinez of Granby, the only defending champion, repeated at 105, though he needed a controversial near-pin call at the buzzer to decision Dave O'Brien of Williams, 6-4.

Robinson Racks Up Regional Tournament

The surprising Robinson Rams rolled to their second consecutive tournament at the regional tournament at the strangers from Sideburn Road had two champions and will advance five men to this weekend's state championships in Norfolk.

At 98, in a battle of unbeaten, Woodson's Steve Whittemore racked up an impressive overtime victory over Williams' Jeff O'Brien. O'Brien got the first takedown early in the opening period when he pulled up on a whizzer, but was quickly reversed by Whittemore, who rode the remainder of the period. O'Brien surprised Whittemore in the next stanza by throwing him on his back and gaining a two-point nearfall. Whittemore carried the match out of bounds and got two for the reversal on a switch from the referee's position. O'Brien fell to his back, and Whittemore was awarded a two-point nearfall. O'Brien recovered and reversed to tie the score at six all, sending the match into overtime.

O'Brien scored a quick takedown, and rode the rest of the period, but in the second period, Whittemore reversed and sent O'Brien to his back for two, points, and rode the duration of the third period to hold on for the 4-2 win.

Andy Lokie of Lee took third with a 7-1 win over Oakton's Tom Dursee.

In the 105 pound class, the other half of the O'Brien clan,

David, handed Jefferson's George Kult his first defeat of the year by a score of 8-1. O'Brien scored a quick takedown with a head and ankle, and dominated the rest of the match.

Third place went to Jim Schollhammer of Madison, who scored a 1-0 upset win over his longtime nemesis, McLean's Mike Jackie.

At 112, Langley's Robert Peach totaled Lee's Skip Lawson with a 3-0 win. A quick takedown and a riding point accounted for the scoring.

Jim Kirby of Robinson took third when Annandale's Sean Kelley forfeited.

Stuart's Jeff Havard added another in a string of victories by putting down Marshall's Steve Brown 8-5 at 119. Brown took early control with a takedown, but Havard regained control in the second period with a reversal and two three-point near falls. Brown escaped and got a takedown, but it wasn't enough to catch Havard,

who gained his first regional title.

Third place went to Joe Flynn of T.C. Williams, who beat Fairfax's John Gardener 10-1.

At 126, the tournament's outstanding wrestler, Jim Hicks of Stuart, downed an aggressive Lloyd Lee of Williams by a one-sided score of 7-2. Hicks got the first takedown, but Lee escaped quickly, so Hicks took him down again. Lee got another escape, and Hicks got yet another takedown. Hicks' final score came on a third period escape.

Steve Kish of Oakton took third by downing Robinson's Blaine Underwood 8-4.

In another exciting overtime at 132, Robinson's John Kuhr pulled out an upset over Jefferson's Kevin Reilly by a 2-0 margin. Reilly started out the regulation with a takedown, but Kuhr evened it up on a reversal. The second period went scoreless, and in the third period Kuhr was awarded a penalty point. Reilly's riding time tied the score at 3-3 and sent the match into overtime. Kuhr got a quickie takedown in the first extra stanza, and held on for the title.

Edison's Warren Aldrich defeated Mount Vernon's Mike Barron for third, 8-5.

At 138 pounds, Robinson's Paul Thorpe went out like a whirlwind, taking down Mount Vernon's Sean McLaurin in the first seven seconds and kept rolling up points until the buzzer ended the slaughter at 21-9.

Hayfield's Tad MacDonnell captured third by blanking John Schnibbe of Langley 4-0.

Mount Vernon's Max Lorenzo overcame several early scares and downed a hard-fighting Jack Salter 12-6. Salter, a standout for Madison during the year, went to work quickly, taking Lorenzo down. Later in the match, Lorenzo found himself on his back, and unfamiliar position for the outstanding Major. Max figured things out quickly, and started

stockpiling points for his victory.

Langley's Bruce Anderson repeated his wrestleback victory over Elmore Kyle of T.C. Williams, this time by a first period pin.

After a scoreless first period, Lee's Eric Heinonen found the winning combination with a switch and reverse half-nelson pin over Woodson's nose-guarded Rick Ladson in 2:34.

In the consolations, Williams' John Leber had no problem taking third by downing Yorktown's John Reisenman 5-0.

At 167, Moe Haislip's escape with time running out in the second period was the margin of victory as he squeaked by Woodson's Mike

D'Antonio 1-0.

Madison's Roy Weaver finished third with a 7-2 win over Bob Cochran of Falls Church.

Lee's Dan Reedy captured the 185-pound regional crown with a 3-0 win over McLean's Vince Belser. A second period penalty point broke a scoreless duel to give the edge to Reedy. Reedy made quick use of his good fortune as he escaped Belser's grasp to up the score to 2-0. A riding time point awarded to Reedy closed out the scoring.

A rematch of the quarterfinal duel between Stuart's Mark Temple and Robinson's Greg Spaete went the opposite way as Temple triumphed 8-2 in overtime.

The final match of the tournament saw Mount Vernon's Jim Myers square off with Yorktown's massive Gary Pinkett. Pinkett used a classic front bearhug takedown to gain a two-point lead. Myers got a penalty point when the referee accused Pinkett of locking his hands. However, Pinkett was not too badly affected by the call as he pinned Myers in the next period.

Third place at unlimited went to Stuart's Tim Cook, who repeated an earlier victory over Kevin Flatt of Edison with a pin in 2:48. Pinkett and Cook were tied for the most pins in the tournament, but the pins trophy was awarded to Pinkett on the basis of the least time taken.

As previously stated, Robinson gathered the team laurels with 81 1/2 points. Williams, defending regional champions, came in second with 74 1/2 points. The rest of the top ten finished like this Lee 65 1/2, Mount Vernon 64, Stuart 61 1/2, Woodson 56 1/2, Madison 52, Jefferson 50 1/2, Yorktown 46, and Langley 44.

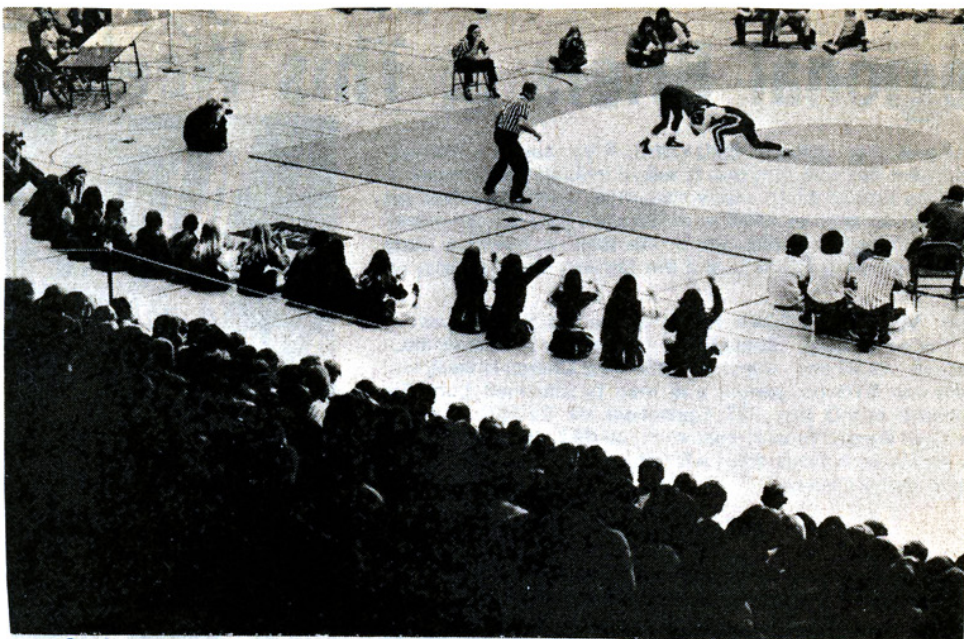
